OLD BUSINESS:

Firefighter/EMT Canvas:

Mr. Schultz reported that the canvas letters went out to the fifty candidates that scored 90 or above. Deadline to return the canvas letter is November 21. At that time, candidates that indicated they were interested and hold the EMS certification level of EMT-P will be sent a candidate survey to gather more information from them prior to an interview.

NEW BUSINESS:

Building Use:

A motion was made by Mr. Diamond, seconded by Mr. Karoglanian, to approve a building use request from the Rotary District to use the large conference room on December 11, 2017 from 6:00PM-7:00PM, with no deposit required. All Commissioners present voted in the affirmative. Motion approved.

A motion was made by Mr. Diamond, seconded by Mr. Karoglanian, to approve a building use request from the Pointe East Homeowners Association to use the small conference room on November 28, 2017 from 8:30AM-10:00AM, with no deposit required. All Commissioners present voted in the affirmative. Motion approved.

Budget Adjustment:

Ms. Shanahan presented a budget adjustment to cover the cost of unforeseen repairs to Truck 3 and the additional office supplies and equipment. A motion was made by Mr. Karoglanian, seconded by Mr. Diamond, to approve the following adjustment to the 2017 Budget:

<u>DFD Inc. Fundraising Letter:</u> Mr. Schultz distributed, prior to the meeting, a draft version of the annual fundraising letter. After a discussion, a motion was made by Mr. Karoglanian and seconded by Mr. Diamond to approve the letter with the discussed edits. Three Commissioners present voting affirmative, one voting negative (Bronstein). Motion approved.

Election Hours and Inspectors:

A motion was made by Mr. Karoglanian, seconded by Mr. Diamond to set the hours of the December 12, 2017 Annual Commissioner Election from 4:00PM to 9:00PM and to employ Mr. Philip Resch as Election Chairman and Mr. Garratt Savage and Mr. Jack Glisson as Inspectors and ballot clerks and to compensate them in the amount of \$50.00 each. Mr. Schultz further moved that if Mr. Resch was unable to perform these duties that another inspector, to be named later, would be appointed. All Commissioners present voting in the affirmative. Motion approved.

Apparatus Bay Man Door:

Chief Green presented three quotes to replace the exterior man door on the west side of the station. Quotes were received from Commercial Door Company (\$3,347.63), BR Johnson (\$2638.45) and Mid-State Door (\$5,140.00). A motion was made by Mr. Karoglanian and seconded by Mr. Diamond to award the contract to BR Johnson in an amount not to exceed \$2,638.45. All Commissioners present voting affirmative. Motion approved.

Thermal Imaging Camera Purchase:

Chief Green reported to the Board that the current thermal imaging cameras have become outdated and obsolete. He has obtained four (4) quotes to replace three thermal imaging cameras with new current technology cameras. Quotes were obtained from MES (\$19,500), Har-Rob (\$23,247), Jerome Fire Equipment (\$24,264) and First Out Rescue (\$16,260). A motion was made by Mr. Diamond and seconded by Mr. Karoglanian to purchase three (3) thermal imaging cameras from First Out Rescue subject to a Permissive Referendum, for the sum of \$16,260.00, with the money coming out of the Equipment Reserve Fund. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative. Motion approved as follows:

RESOLVED: Any monies received from the sale of the current equipment shall be paid into the Equipment Reserve Fund pursuant to Section 6g, Paragraph 5 of the General Municipal Law, and be it further

RESOLVED: This Resolution is adopted subject to a Permissive Referendum pursuant to Town Law Section 176, Paragraph 23.

Mr. Schultz will place a Legal Notice with the Post Standard Newspaper.

Heavy Rescue Tool Purchase:

Chief Green reported to the Board that the current heavy rescue tools outdated for today's automobile technology and unsafe. He has obtained a quote from Har-Rob Fire Apparatus as sole source for Holmatro Heavy Rescue Tools. A motion was made by Mr. Karoglanian and seconded by Mr. Diamond to purchase two (2) sets of heavy rescue tools to outfit Engine 1 and Engine 8 including heavy duty incline cutters, spreaders, large telescopic rams, and all necessary fittings and hoses from Har-Rob Fire Apparatus subject to a Permissive Referendum, for the sum of \$36,423.00, with the money coming out of the Equipment Reserve Fund. All Commissioners voted in the affirmative. Motion approved as follows:
